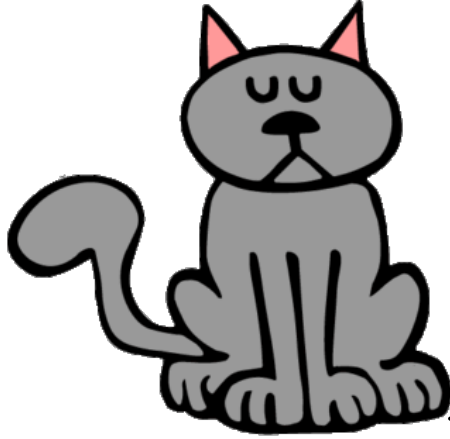

"Stood apart with aloof dignity"



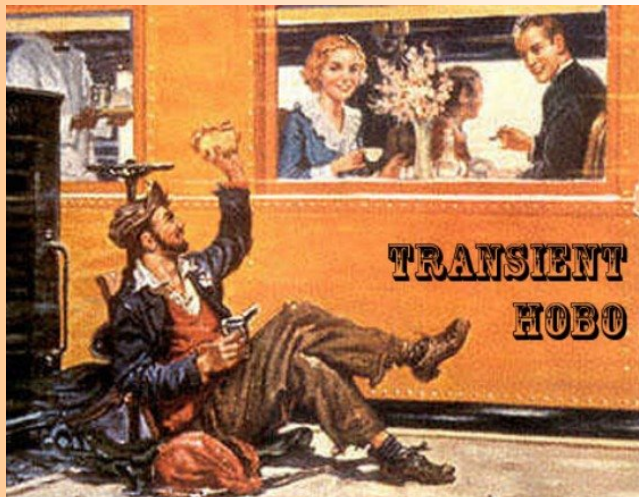

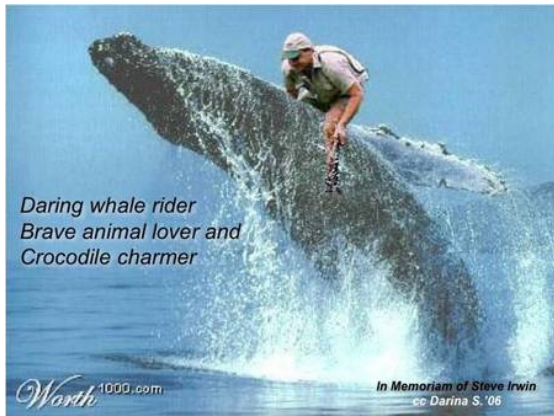

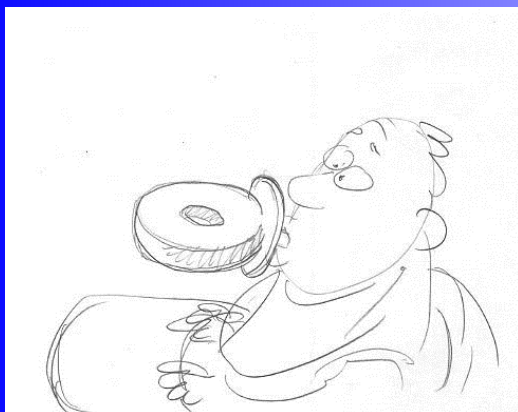
