The Hero's Journey: Hercules

Background

Hercules, son of Greek gods Zeus and Hera, was a Greek hero known for his superior strength. The character is charged with a quest

Mythical creatures help the character

The character travels to other worlds

becomes Hades' property.



The character reaches a low point Hercules makes a deal with Hades. He promises to give up his strength to Hades to keep Meg from harm. After Hades agrees, he then reveals that Meg was working for him the whole time. Hades takes advantage of Hercules weakness and starts chaos on Earth and on Mount Olympus with the newly released Titans.

The character is resurrected
